

How to Do a Home Viewing of: “From Ritual to Relationship”

Step 1: If possible try to go to a daily mass.

Step 2: To start a session, open with the prayer on the handout that corresponds to the session you are watching.

Step 3: Open up a web browser (Google Chrome, Firefox, Internet Explorer, Safari, Microsoft Edge, etc...) on your computer.

Step 4: To start for the first sessions type the **Session 1 web address:** https://youtu.be/CqQC4E_vvrQ into the address bar at the top of the screen and press “Enter”.

Step 5: Watch the video.

Step 6: Discuss the questions on the handout (that corresponds to what session you are watching) with whoever you are watching with, or just reflect on them in prayer if you are alone.

Step 7: Close with a prayer for all those who are participating in the mission and for the evangelization of the world!

PERSONAL REFLECTION or GROUP DISCUSSION QUESTIONS: *(choose 1 or 2)*

- Are you the type of person that naturally approaches God through ritual or relationship? Why?
- What are your struggles with the whole concept of rituals?
- What are your struggles with thinking/talking about your "relationship with God"?
- What steps have you taken/could you take to resolve your understanding or lived experience of either rituals or your difficulties with a "relationship with God"?
- Generally speaking, how have rituals (or a specific ritual) helped you in your life?
- In your religious training, what has been insufficient with regard to knowledge of God and His ways: Bible study, rituals/Sacraments/Mass, prayer/devotions, nature of the Church (ecclesiology), Church history, doctrines, theology, morality/ethics, the spiritual and corporal works of mercy? How will you grow deeper now?
- Was there something else in the presentation that struck you?

CLOSING PRAYER: *(or Closing Prayer of the Mass of the Day can be used)*

"Lord, we thank you for all You have revealed to us about Yourself and Your ways. Help us to keep Your Word and meditate on it daily in our minds and hearts. PERSONAL REFLECTION or GROUP DISCUSSION QUESTIONS: *(choose 1 or 2)*

--How would you sum up "God's system," what "salvation history" is if someone asked you "what you believe" or "what Catholic Christianity is all about"?

--In one sentence (or a 30-second "elevator speech")—What is your personal "salvation history"? What would it be in a paragraph (or 3 minutes)?

--Have you always understood that our Catholic Christian Faith consists of the unchanging "deposit of faith," of "Revelation" that must be put into practice, transmitted and guarded with fidelity? If not, what was your understanding of the Catholic Church's teachings? How is this new understanding a gift?

--Have you or someone you know had a powerful experience of God through one of the Sacraments, prayer or devotions? If so, what happened? (Sometimes the most powerful experiences are very interior and quiet.)

--Which public Catholic devotions or private prayers do you "lean on" the most? Why?

--Was there something else in the presentation that struck you?

PERSONAL REFLECTION or GROUP DISCUSSION QUESTIONS: (choose 1 or 2)

--How can the Mass and the Sacraments help keep us grounded in God's actual reality, when we are spending more and more time with screens and immersive environments? What other ways can our Faith keep us more in touch with each other, face to face, more in touch with God's Creation?

--Would you say you have a "sacramental worldview"? Explain.

--How can parishes or Catholic groups and organizations be better at fellowship--especially when people (including young people) are often so busy, lonely, isolated, fearful, discouraged, or "living" in virtual reality?

--Would you say you are consciously striving for holiness? Do you want to become "a saint"? How are you letting the Holy Spirit transform you? How are you cooperating with God's grace?

--Do you find God and your Faith comforting or challenging...or both? Explain.

--What is the place of silence in your life, in your relationship with God?

--Is the Father "very fond of you"? How would you describe your friendship with Jesus?

--Was there something else in the presentation that struck you?

CLOSING PRAYER: (or *Closing Prayer of the Mass of the Day can be used*)
